NOTICE TO THE BAR AND TO THE PUBLIC


In Re: Returned Checks Unpaid due to Insufficient Funds

Pursuant to 29 USC §1930, a fee of \$35 is due to the Clerk of the Court for any check returned unpaid due to insufficient funds and/or uncollected funds.

Effective on the date of this notice:

- 1. No further personal checks will be accepted from a law firm, lawyer or any other party if a check has been returned unpaid because of insufficient funds and/or uncollected funds, unless a letter is received from the bank stating the check was returned due to a bank error.**
- 2. The name of the law firm, lawyer or such other party as identified on the check that has been returned unpaid will be added to a list maintained at the cashier's work station. Before accepting any personal check, the cashier will verify such list to determine if the check can be accepted. Only official Manager's Check, U.S. Postmaster Draft, Certified Check, Money Order or cash will be accepted in these situations.**
- 3. Checks returned unpaid must be replaced by an official Manager's Check, U.S. Postmaster Draft, Money Order, Certified Check, or cash. The substitution payment fee of \$35 must also be paid prior to accepting the substitution payment. No substitute payment will be accepted if the fee is not included.**
