Notice to the Bar and the Public

In Re: Suspension CM/ECF Privileges

A recent upgrade of CM/ECF, our electronic filing system, allows us to automatically lock out users who fail to pay filing fees at the time of filing in accordance with Title 28 U.S.C. §1930. Therefore, effective **December 3, 2012**, the court will strictly enforce Fed. R. Bankr. P. 1006, hence the failure to file a bankruptcy petition accompanied by the filing fee may result in the suspension of your CM/ECF privileges.

Users who do not comply with Fed. R. Bankr. P. 1006 and 28 U.S.C. §1930 will receive an e-mail notification of outstanding fees in addition to the entry of the Notice of Deficiency. Failure to pay these fees may result in the dismissal of the case without further notice, in addition to the suspension of the filing privileges.

Once locked out of the system, users will have limited access to run reports and make their outstanding payment. **Full access rights will be restored in the CM/ECF system after all outstanding fees have been paid in full.**

In the event of an emergency filing, the attorney must file a motion requesting permission to file conventionally. He/she shall explain the reason for the suspension of their electronic filing privileges.
